Memorandum of Understanding

- Services to be Provided, including coordination and delivery
- Funding of services and operating costs (cash and in-kind contributions and infrastructure costs)
- Methods to ensure customer needs are met
- Duration of agreement and procedures for amending
- Reviewed no less than every three (3) years

Infrastructure Costs

- Non-personnel costs necessary for:
 - General operation of the center

- Rent
- Utilities and maintenance
- Equipment
- Technology to facilitate access
- Planning and outreach activities

OhioMeansJobs Operator

- Designated by local board and chief elected officials
- Competitive Procurement

Certification and Continuous Improvement of OhioMeansJobs Centers

- Local Board certifies at least once every three (3) years
- State, in consultation with Chief Elected Officials and Local Boards, establishes criteria and procedures for certification
- Certification based on achievement of performance measures, integration of services, and meets needs of employers and participants
- Local boards may adopt additional or higher standards
