What is TechCred?

The program funds up to 20,000 technologyfocused credentials over the next two years. For a credential to qualify, it:

- Must be short-term, less than one year to complete
- Must be technology-focused
- Must be industry-recognized

WIOA SUCCESS STORY:

Alyssa Kauffman entered the program as a single mother with three kids who was receiving cash assistance. Early on, it became apparent that Alyssa wanted to make the most of her opportunities within the program and identified to her Employment Specialist that she wanted to become a welder, figuring it would be stable employment and give her the opportunities she needed to provide for herself and her children. She knew a little about welding on the front-end, but with the help of her Employment Specialist, decided to pursue training at Madison Adult Career Center. She took evening classes toward her welding certificate and during her break, began working full time at Goyal Industries as a welder. In December of 2019, she completed welding certifications at Madison and is on track for a successful future toward independence.




in person could vote via social media or text. Officers representing both In-School and Out-of-School Youth were chosen.






JOB CENTER ACTIVITIES

FREE EXPUNGEMENT CLINIC: in November, we offered a free Expungement Clinic at our Job Center.. A local attorney agreed to provide a free one-on-one consultation with individuals who might be eligible to have their record sealed. We promoted the event with some basic information to screen out some obvious disqualifiers (violent offenses etc.)

15 record each of Most seemed to be good candidates for expungement and most were already working but either wanted to get a better job or just wanted it sealed for their own peace of mind. All were appreciative for the assistance!

WIOA Education & Training/Employment Services

 OMJ Richland assisted <u>53</u> individuals with WIOA education & training/employment services, expending <u>\$211,158.20</u> in funds.

TANF Prevention, Retention and Contingency (PRC) Services

- OMJ Richland provided <u>398 PRC</u> emergency services (<u>141</u> housing services, <u>92</u> transportation services and <u>165</u> utility services) for a total of \$291,410.27 in services.
- OMJ Richland assisted <u>9</u> individuals with TANF funded short-term education services/education and employment supportive services for a total of <u>\$6265.38</u> in services.
